Solutions

S1. Ans.(e)

Sol. All are correct.

S2. Ans.(c)

Sol. As per the context of the sentence, 'whole' will be used here and not 'hole'. 'Whole refers to all of; entire.

S3. Ans.(d)

Sol. 'develop' is used incorrectly here. We will use 'developing' instead as flying is used in the former part of sentence and as per parallelism, developing must be used.

S4. Ans.(d)

Sol. There is a spelling error in this sentence. Correct spelling is immense.

S5. Ans.(b)

Sol. The phrase making an eye is incorrect here. Keeping an eye means to watch someone or something carefully; to be attentive to someone or something. Hence, keeping an eye will be used here.

S6. Ans.(C)

Sol. Error is in part C of the sentence. 'To' will be followed by first form of verb, hence 'to meet' will be the correct use.

S7. Ans.(d)

Sol. Error is in part D. 'Kick in' is a phrasal verb that means come into effect or operation. Hence, 'kicks in' will be used here and not "kicks inside".

S8. Ans.(b)

Sol. Error is in part B of the sentence. 'Have triggered' will be used and not 'have trigger'. We use Present perfect tense to show relation between a present and a recently concluded event and so have will take participle form of verb here.

S9. Ans.(c)

Sol. Error is in part C of the sentence. 'Eliminate' will be used instead of 'eliminated' as the sentence is in present tense.

S10. Ans.(e)

Sol. There is no error in any part of the sentence.

S11. Ans.(c)

Sol. 'Longstanding' means having existed or continued for a long time. The passage here tries to convey that despite our long time dependence on grammar, a new communication medium has emerged.

S12. Ans.(e)

Sol. 'Unprecedented' means never done or known before. Hence, it fits into the blank correctly.

S13. Ans.(a)


Sol. Ubiquitous means present, appearing, or found everywhere. The former part of sentence says that almost everyone texts regularly as a main method of communication, which means it is very common. So, ubiquitous is the correct choice here.

S14. Ans.(c)

Sol. As per the context of the passage, interact is the most appropriate choice here.

S15. Ans.(b)

Sol. As 'unfortunately' is written just before the blank, which means a negative word is required here. So, 'diminishes' is the most appropriate choice here.



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
