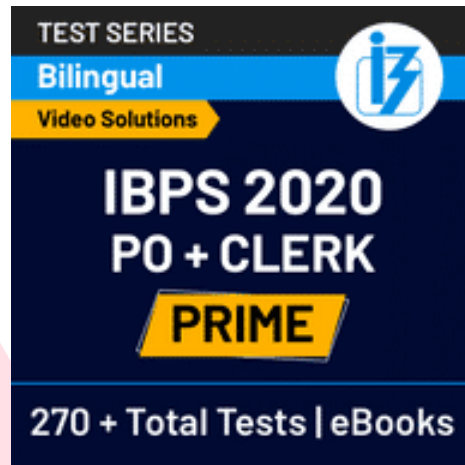

Solutions

S1. Ans. (b)

Sol. B-C needs to be interchanged to form a correct sentence. The sentence thus formed is:
*Air passengers have a **legitimate** right to get full **refund** for their tickets **cancelled** due to no fault of their own during the national **lockdown**.*

S2. Ans. (d)

Sol. A-B needs to be interchanged to form a correct sentence. The sentence thus formed is:
*The southwest **monsoon** picked up over Kerala after a **lull** under the **influence** of a low pressure area that **formed** over the Arabian Sea.*

S3. Ans. (b)

Sol. B-C needs to be interchanged to form a correct sentence. The sentence thus formed is:
*Concerns have been **raised** regarding the **impact** of U.S.-based evangelical **donors** in regard to Indian **associations**.*

S4. Ans. (a)

Sol. A-D needs to be interchanged to form a correct sentence. The sentence thus formed is:
*The Defence **Ministers** of India and Iran **discussed** ways to take forward **bilateral** cooperation and **exchanged** views on regional security issues.*

S5. Ans. (e)

Sol. All of the highlighted words are correctly used here and requires no interchange. So, the correct answer choice is option (e).

S6. Ans. (c)

Sol. The given sentence will become grammatically and contextually correct if (A) and (D) are interchanged. Therefore, option (c) is the most suitable answer choice.

S7. Ans. (d)

Sol. The given sentence will become grammatically and contextually correct if (A) and (D) and (B) and (C) are interchanged. Therefore, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

S8. Ans. (d)

Sol. The given sentence will become grammatically and contextually correct if (A) and (C) and (B) and (D) are interchanged. Therefore, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

S9. Ans. (c)

Sol. The given sentence will become grammatically and contextually correct if (D) and (A) interchanged. Therefore, option (c) is the most suitable answer choice.

S10. Ans. (e)

Sol. The given sentence is contextually and grammatically correct, hence no correction is required. Therefore, option (e) is the most suitable answer choice.

S11. Ans. (d)

Sol. Articulate means having or showing the ability to speak fluently and coherently. Therefore, "eloquent: persuasive" is the set of words that expresses the synonyms of the given highlighted word. Hence, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

Segregated- set apart from the rest or from each other; isolate or divide

Absolve- declare (someone) free from guilt, obligation, or punishment

S12. Ans. (a)

Sol. "Abjure" means solemnly renounce (a belief, cause, or claim). Therefore, the set of words that consists of its synonym is "relinquish: renounce". Hence, option (a) is the most suitable answer choice.

Relinquish- voluntarily cease to keep or claim; give up

Barbaric-savagely cruel

Adapt means make (something) suitable for a new use or purpose; modify.

Antidote means a medicine taken or given to counteract a particular poison.

Apposite means apt in the circumstances or in relation to something.

S13. Ans. (c)

Sol. “benign” means gentle and kind. Therefore, the set of words that reflect the synonym and antonym of the given highlighted word is “affectionate: hostile”. Hence, option (c) is the most suitable answer choice.

Affectionate- readily feeling or showing fondness or tenderness;

Foster- encourage the development of (something, especially something desirable);

Accordance means in a manner conforming with.

Apprehension means understanding; grasp.

Discordance means unconformity.

S14. Ans. (e)

Sol. “Evanescence” means soon passing out of sight, memory, or existence; quickly fading or disappearing. Therefore, the set of words that reflect the antonyms of the given highlighted word is “unlimited: permanent”. Hence, option (e) is the most suitable answer choice.

Subvert means undermine the power and authority of (an established system or institution).

Depose means remove from office suddenly and forcefully.

Facilitation means the action of facilitating something.

S15. Ans. (b)

Sol. Concomitantly: at the same time; simultaneously.

Both the words are synonyms of the given word. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

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
