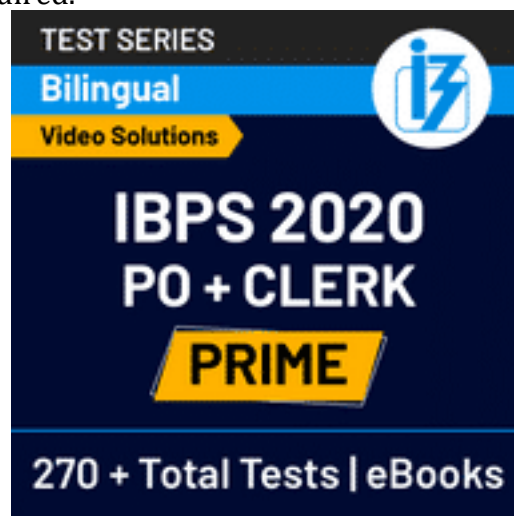

Solutions

Sol. C-A will replace each other in order to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

Sol. Both A-B and C-E will replace each other in order to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.
