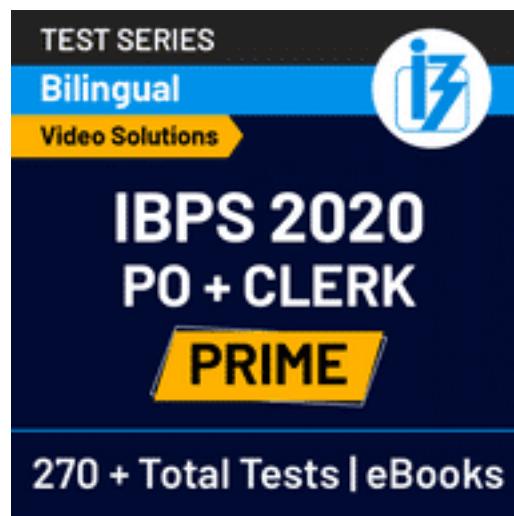

Solutions
