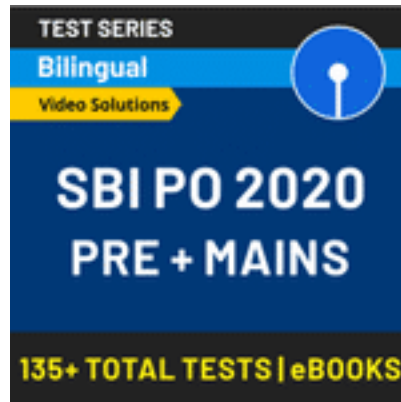

SOLUTIONS

S1. Ans. (b)

Sol. A-F can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

“During the hearing, the foreigners were produced before the court”. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S2. Ans. (c)

Sol. C-E can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice. *“Delhi Police will update the list of most-wanted criminals.”*

S3. Ans. (a)

Sol. B-F can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice. *“Students do not have access to affordable and uninterrupted Internet connectivity.”*

S4. Ans. (d)

Sol. C-D can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice. *“It is just not feasible to hold exams in the current situation.”*

S5. Ans. (b)

Sol. A-F can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice. *Supreme Court gave judgment on criminalization in politics.”*

S6. Ans. (c)

Sol. C-E can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice. *Using money power to buy MLAs and MPs sometimes makes a mockery of election outcomes.”*

S7. Ans. (d)

Sol. C-F can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice. *"The regulation adds a new dimension to the pandemic-riddled academic year."*

S8. Ans. (b)

Sol. A-F can be joined to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence.

Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice. *"COVID-19 has already wrecked every financial planning revolving around international students."*

S9. Ans. (d)

Sol. The correct sequence of the given sentence is **BDCA**. The sentence after rearrangement is, *The Union Health Ministry is closely watching (B)/ the dynamic evolution of the virus (D)/ situation in India, with the WHO now (C)/ indicating that the virus may be airborne (A)*

Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

S10. Ans. (a)

Sol. The correct sequence of the given sentence is **CBAD**. The sentence after rearrangement is, *We are laying a red carpet for all global companies to come and establish their presence in India.*

Hence, option (a) is the right answer choice.

S11. Ans. (c)

Sol. The correct sequence of the given sentence is **DCBA**. The sentence after rearrangement is, *Mr. Modi's reference to "green shoots" or small signs of revival comes a few days after the Ministry of Finance published its macroeconomic report for June 2020.*

Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S12. Ans. (b)

Sol. The correct sequence of the given sentence is **ADBC**. The sentence after rearrangement is, *The television was received as a donation to facilitate her remote education, but it was of no use as her rented house had no power connection.*

Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S13. Ans. (d)

Sol. The correct sequence of the given sentence is **BDCA**. The sentence after rearrangement is, *The University is pushing the examination schedule to a date beyond August 15 knowing very well that the career of thousands of students hinges on the results.*

Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

S14. Ans. (b)

Sol. The correct sequence of the given sentence is **ADBC**. The sentence after rearrangement is, *Though the total cases in Delhi have been increasing, the active cases have been constantly decreasing for the past seven days from July 1.*

Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S15. Ans. (c)

Sol. The correct sequence of the given sentence is DCBA. The sentence after rearrangement is, *After a modified 'Revised Delhi COVID Response Plan' was released, some of the districts have decided on dates for holding camps for testing special surveillance groups.*

Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

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
