

(i): Relying routinely on correlation, Epidemiologists and public health professionals draw countrywide estimates of the health risk posed by a particular pollutant.

(ii): In order to draw countrywide estimates of the health risk posed by a particular pollutant Epidemiologists and public health routinely rely on correlation.
