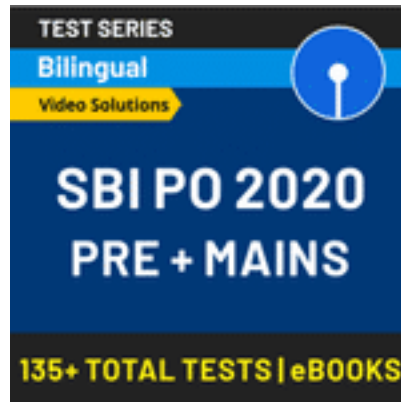

Solutions
