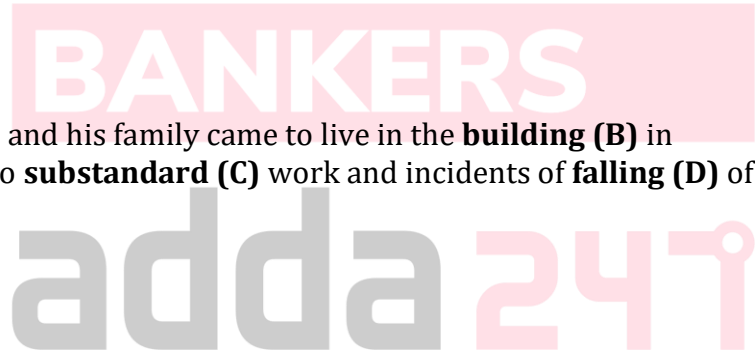

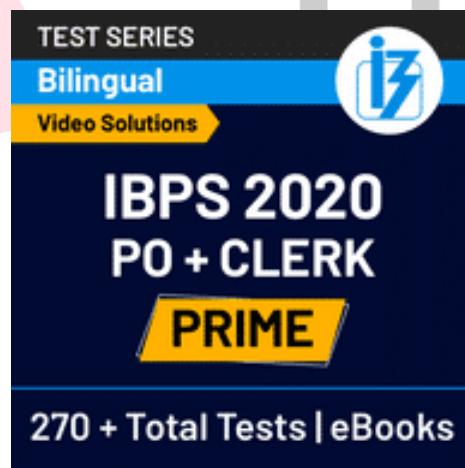

Solutions

S3. Ans. (c)

Sol. C-B will replace each other in order to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (d)

Sol. Both A-D and B-C will replace each other in order to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (d)

Sol. Both A-B and C-D will replace each other in order to make the sentence grammatically and contextually correct. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S6. Ans. (b)
