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Solutions

S1. Ans. (b)

Sol. Pupil: The dark circular opening in the centre of the iris of the eye and dilated pupils means to have pupils which are larger than the normal size.

Pupil: To describe a person who is taught by another, especially a schoolchild or student in relation to a teacher.

Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S2. Ans. (d)

Sol. To tender: to offer or present something formally, like a resignation.

-an offer to carry out work for a fixed price like a tender for securing a government contract.

Tender also means formally offer (a stated fixed price) for carrying out work, supplying goods, etc.

Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (b)

Sol. The noun 'season' is a fixed time in the year when a particular sporting activity is pursued, such as the Olympics. The verb 'season' means to apply spices or flavourings to food. Sentence I and III use the given word correctly. But statement II does not make any sense. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (e)

Sol. Headwind: A wind having the opposite general direction to a course of movement (as of an aircraft). It also means a force or influence that inhibits progress

Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (d)

Sol. Commission: a group of people entrusted by a government or other official body with authority to do something.

-An order for something, especially a work of art, to be produced specially.

Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer.

S6. Ans. (b)

Sol. Change: to become different; alter; vary.

Change: coins of small denomination which is correctly used in the sentence.

Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S7. Ans. (e)

Sol. Cast aside(phrasal verb): getting rid of something.

Cast: the actors taking part in a play, film, or other production.

Cast: cause (light or shadow) to appear on a surface.

Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

S8. Ans. (a)

Sol. Smell a rat: Suspect that something is not right.

Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

S9. Ans. (c)

Sol. Low hanging fruit: a goal that can be easily reached/ something that is easy to take advantage of.

Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S10. Ans. (b)

Sol. Not a moment too soon: in the nick of time, only just in time.

Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S11. Ans. (c)

Sol. All bark and no bite: Full of talk that is more threatening or impressive than that which one can or will actually do.

Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S12. Ans. (a)

Sol. All Greek To Me: When something is extremely difficult to understand due to being new and complex.

Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

S13. Ans. (b)

Sol. Go up in smoke: be destroyed or ruined

Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S14. Ans. (a)

Sol. Let off steam: Get rid of pent-up energy or strong emotion.

Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

S15. Ans. (c)

Sol. Give someone the cold shoulder: Ignore someone

Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

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
