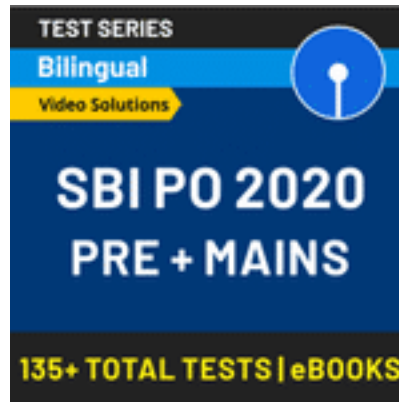

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Solutions

S1. Ans. (c)

Sol. **“Disengage, Pull back”** best fits the meaning of the sentence as a whole. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

Disengage- remove (troops) from an area of conflict.

Pull back- retreat or cause troops to retreat from an area.

S2. Ans. (a)

Sol. **“Permit, Conducted”** best fits the meaning of the sentence as a whole. Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (d)

Ans. **“Waded in, Chaotic”** best fits the meaning of the sentence as a whole. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

Wade in- If someone wades in or wades into something, they get involved in a very determined and forceful way, often without thinking enough about the consequences of their actions. OR to enter a discussion, argument etc in a forceful and annoying way, often without thinking about the possible results.

Chaotic- in a state of complete confusion and disorder.

Call upon- demand that (someone) do something.

Refuted- prove (a statement or theory) to be wrong or false; disprove. OR deny or contradict (a statement or accusation).

S8. Ans. (c)

Sol. **"Outbreak, Sensitive"** best fits the meaning of the sentence as a whole. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

Sol. **Undesirable** fits into both the blanks appropriately adding a proper and logical meaning to the sentences. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

Acquittal- a judgement or verdict that a person is not guilty of the crime with which they have been charged.

Heinous- (of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked.

Emblematic- serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept; symbolic.

Grievously- to a very severe or serious degree.
