

Solutions:

S1. Ans. (b)

Sol. **Unabated**- without any reduction in intensity or strength.

Persistent- continuing firmly or obstinately in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition.

Unrelenting- not yielding in strength, severity, or determination.

Both the words given in **option (b)** are synonyms of the given word.

S2. Ans. (d)

Sol. **Tardy**- delaying or delayed beyond the right or expected time; late.

Overdue- not having arrived, happened, or been done by the expected time.

Punctual- happening or doing something at the agreed or proper time.

Both the words given in **option (d)** are synonym and antonym respectively of the given word.

S3. Ans. (b)

Sol. **Hobble**- walk in an awkward way, typically because of pain from an injury.

Lurch- make an abrupt, unsteady, uncontrolled movement or series of movements; stagger.

Stumble- trip or momentarily lose one's balance; almost fall.

Both the words given in **option (b)** are synonyms of the given word.

S4. Ans. (c)

Sol. **Plaguing**- cause continual trouble or distress to.

Pester- trouble or annoy (someone) with frequent or persistent requests or interruptions.

Mither- pester or irritate (someone).

Both the words given in **option (c)** are synonyms of the given word.

S5. Ans. (a)

Sol. **Heaped**- to give readily and in large quantities

Both the words given in **option (a)** are antonyms of the given word.

S6. Ans. (c)

Sol. **Distraught-** feeling overwhelming fear or worry

All the words except **option (c)** are synonyms of the given word.

S7. Ans. (b)

Sol. **Hurtled-** to proceed or move quickly

All the words except **option (b)** are either synonym or antonyms of the given word.

S8. Ans. (e)

Sol. **Desist-** stop doing something; cease or abstain

All the words except **option (e)** are either synonym or antonym of the given word.

S9. Ans. (c)

Sol. **Indiscriminate-** done at random or without careful judgement.

All the words except **option (c)** are either synonym or antonym of the given word.

S10. Ans. (d)

Sol. **Aggregate-** a material or structure formed from a mass of fragments or particles loosely compacted together.

OR formed or calculated by the combination of several separate elements; total.

OR a whole formed by combining several separate elements.

All the words except **option (d)** are synonyms of the given word.

S11. Ans. (d)

Sol. B and D are synonymous to each other. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

Hasten- cause (something, especially something undesirable) to happen sooner than it otherwise would.

Expedite- make (an action or process) happen sooner or be accomplished more quickly.

S12. Ans. (e)

Sol. A and D are opposite in meaning with each other. Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

Articulate- having or showing the ability to speak fluently and coherently.

Unintelligible- impossible to understand.

S13. Ans. (c)

Sol. A and C are similar in meaning with each other. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

Colossal- extremely large or great.

Gigantic- of very great size or extent; huge or enormous.

S14. Ans. (d)

Sol. B and D are similar in meaning with each other. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

Abysmal- extremely bad; appalling.

Atrocious- of a very poor quality; extremely bad or unpleasant.

S15. Ans. (e)

Sol. A and D are similar in meaning with each other. Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

Plight- a dangerous, difficult, or otherwise unfortunate situation.

Predicament- a difficult, unpleasant, or embarrassing situation.

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
