




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Underpin - सहारा देना


Verb: to prop up or support from below; strengthen, as by reinforcing a foundation; to replace or strengthen the foundation of (a building or the like); to furnish a foundation for; corroborate.

Synonyms:

build, construct, depend, derive, establish, found, ground, hinge, locate, plant, predicate, prop, rest.

Antonyms:

demolish, destroy, disestablish, dismantle.



If one thing **underpins** another, it helps the other thing to continue or succeed by supporting and strengthening it.

The scientific proof **underpinning** it is also convincing.

Notorious - कुख्यात/ बदनाम

Adjective: famous or well known, typically for some bad quality or deed.

Synonyms:

infamous, of ill repute, with a bad reputation/name, ill-famed, scandalous; well known, famous, famed, renowned

Antonyms:

unknown, anonymous, faceless



Her life was **notorious** for intrigue and perfidy.

Unfortunately, one of the country's most **notorious** criminals is being paroled today.

Probe - जांच/ तहकीकात

Verb: to search into or examine thoroughly; question closely; to examine or explore with a probe; to examine or explore with or as if with a probe.

Noun: the act of probing; a slender surgical instrument for exploring the depth or direction of a wound, sinus, or the like; an investigation, especially by a legislative committee, of suspected illegal activity.

Synonyms:

examination, exploration, inquest, inquiry, research, scrutiny, study, delving, detection, inquisition



The company became enmeshed in a federal **probe** into bribery and conspiracy that has led to charges against about a dozen people.

The pathologist will **probe** the tissue for signs of cancer.

Strident - कठोर

Adjective: making or having a harsh sound; grating; creaking; having a shrill, irritating quality or character.

Synonyms:

blatant, jarring, loud, raucous, vociferous, boisterous, clamorous, clashing, discordant, grating, hoarse, jangling, noisy



Since I had a headache, the bird's chirping sounded quite **strident** to me.

He is a **strident** advocate of nuclear power.

Mar - हानि करना

Verb: to damage or spoil to a certain extent; render less perfect, attractive, useful, etc.; impair or spoil; to disfigure, deface, or scar.

Synonyms:

blight, bruise, harm, impair, ruin, scar, spoil, stain, sully, taint.

Antonyms:

aid, assist, build, clean, create, fix, grow, help, adorn.



You will **mar** the cake if you keep putting your fingers in the icing.

Solidarity - एकजुटता

Noun: union or fellowship arising from common responsibilities and interests, as between members of a group or between classes, peoples, etc.; community of feelings, purposes, etc; community of responsibilities and interests.

Synonyms:

agreement, consensus, harmony, support, teamwork, unanimity, unification, accord, alliance, comradeship, confederation, federation, fellowship, oneness, sameness, uniformity.

Antonyms:

disagreement, agonist, discord,



While the prisoners were of different races, they all joined in **solidarity** to protest their dirty living conditions.

In an unexpected show of **solidarity**, the management and workers have joined forces to campaign against the closure of the factory.

Revulsion- घृणा

Noun: a strong feeling of repugnance, distaste, or dislike:

a sudden and violent change of feeling or response in sentiment, taste, etc; the act of drawing something back or away.

Synonyms:

dislike, distaste, horror, loathing, repulsion, abhorrence, abomination, aversion, detestation, hate, recoil, repugnance.

Antonyms:

like, liking, love, loving





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
