

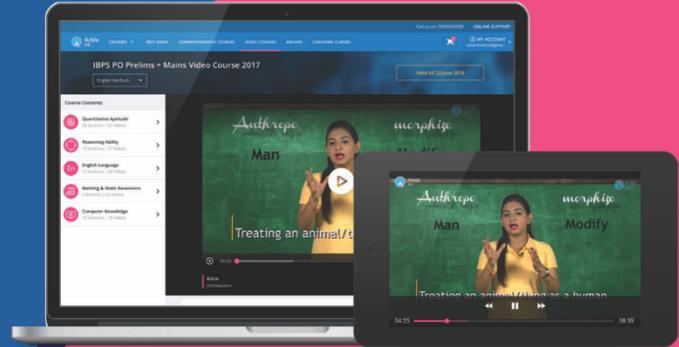
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S1. Ans.(a)

Sol. It's given in the first paragraph that " but let us instead focus on the important aspects that pertain to the data ecosystem'. Hence (a) is the correct option.

S2. Ans.(d)

Sol. From the first and third paragraphs, we can conclude that (i) and (ii) are true. Now it is given in the fourth paragraph that 'Geospatial information, especially when so widely defined, keeps changing'. Hence, (iii) is false. Hence (d) is the correct option.

S3. Ans.(b)

Sol. It is given in the fourth paragraph that 'A government regulator that is yet to be set up...'. Hence, (b) is the correct option.

S4. Ans.(c)

Sol. From the first paragraph, we can conclude that (c) is the correct option.

S5. Ans.(a)

Sol. It is given in the last paragraph that 'To satisfactorily "vet" the complex mishmashes of data that are bound to emerge over time will be a challenging task'. Hence, (a) is the correct option.

S6. Ans.(e)

Sol. A license to kill innovation' is the apt title.

S7. Ans.(a)

Sol. 'Leverage' means 'use (something) to maximum advantage'. Hence, 'advantage' is the word which is most similar in meaning to it.

S8. Ans.(e)

Sol. 'Trajectories' means 'the path followed by a projectile'. Hence, 'course' is the word which is most similar in meaning to it.

S9. Ans.(c)

Sol. 'Acquiring' means 'buy or obtain for oneself'. Hence, 'Forfeit' is the word which is most opposite in meaning to it.

S10. Ans.(b)

Sol. 'Vet' means 'make a careful and critical examination of something'. Hence, 'Overlook' is the word which is most opposite in meaning to it.

S11. Ans.(c)

Sol. 'The recovery from the crisis of 2008 was tepid' suggests that (a) is not the correct option. Passage is silent about any sort of verdict hence (b) is also not the correct option. No governmental barriers have been described in the passage. Hence, (d) is also not the answer.

In the fifth paragraph it is given that 'there were severe supply bottlenecks '.....Agricultural production fell sharply in 2009-10 because of a severe drought.....'. Hence, (c) is the correct option.

S12. Ans.(d)

Sol. In the second last paragraph, it is given that '....."ease of doing business" (i.e.) bureaucratic hurdles which impede speedy execution of projects need to be removed....' Hence, (d) is the correct option.

Red tapism: It refers to excessive regulation or rigid conformity to formal rules that is considered redundant or bureaucratic and hinders or prevents action or decision-making.

Bureaucracy: A system of government in which most of the important decisions are taken by state officials rather than by elected representatives.

S13. Ans.(d)

Sol. According to author, the incremental capital output ratio depends on current account deficit (and not fiscal deficit). Hence (d) is the correct option.

NOTE: Fiscal deficit is when a country spends more on government spending than it takes in taxes and borrowing. Definition of 'Current Account Deficit Occurs when a country's total imports of goods, services and transfers is greater than the country's total export of goods, services and transfers.

S14. Ans.(c)

Sol. It is given in the passage that 'the growth rate achieved in the high phase period of 2005-06 to 2007-08 was robust.' hence we can't infer the same about the whole decade. Besides this, the mentioning of depression of 2008 also suggests that (c) is the correct option.

S15. Ans.(e)

Sol. It is given in the last paragraph of the passage that 'The Indian economy in the recent past has shownhigh growth is very much in the realm of possibility' from which we can infer that it is the past performance of the Indian economy on the basis of which the given conclusion has been made. No option suggests this. Hence, (e) is the correct option.

S16. Ans.(c)

Sol. (i) The given sentence is grammatically correct.

(ii) Use 'the' before 'people' as in the given sentence 'people' is used in the definite sense. The subject 'He' has addressed the particular group of people, hence the article 'the' is required before 'people'.

(iii) The given sentence is grammatically correct.



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S17. Ans.(e)

Sol. All the given sentences are grammatically correct.

S18. Ans.(c)

Sol. Replace 'with' by 'an' as "blind in the right eye/the left eye" is used while "blind with both the eyes" is the correct usage.

S19. Ans.(e)

Sol. Use 'had' after 'No sooner' or replace 'No sooner he left' by 'No sooner did he leave' as in all the cases sentence beginning with 'No sooner', the helping verb it takes always comes before the 'Subject'.

e.g. No sooner did he reach the office than his friend arrived. Or,
No sooner had he reached the office than his friend arrived.

S20. Ans.(a)

Sol. Remove 'kindly' from the sentence as the use of "kindly/Please" in Active voice is stated as "you are requested" in the Passive form. As the sentence is in Passive voice, remove 'Kindly' to make it grammatically correct.

e.g. Please/Kindly shut the door. [Active]

You are requested to shut the door. [Passive]

S21. Ans.(c)

Sol. Consternation means a feeling of anxiety or dismay, typically at something unexpected.

Confederate means supporter.

Malice means ill will.

S22. Ans.(a)

Sol. Outwit means deceive by greater ingenuity.

Languorous means certain kind of mood.

Contours means bounding the shape or form of something.

S23. Ans. (b)

Sol. Admonition means a firm warning or reprimand.

Considerably means by a notably large amount or to a notably large extent; greatly.

S24. Ans.(c)

Sol. Acclimatizing means become accustomed to a new climate or new conditions; adjust.

Bid means make an effort or attempt to achieve.

Requisition means an official order laying claim to the use of property or materials.

Domineering means asserting one's will over another in an arrogant way.



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S25. Ans. (b)

Sol. The paragraph revolves around the theme of Russia as a developmental partner to recognize Afghanistan's Independence from the United Kingdom. After reading all sentences we can conclude that only sentence (b) fits to the paragraph. All other sentences are out of the theme of the paragraph. Hence sentence (b) is the right option.

S26. Ans.(d)

Sol. The paragraph talks about the sheer abstraction of money and its value that lies in medium of exchange. Hence only sentence (d) fits to the paragraph as it talks about attaining its value which can be well connected with the previous sentence. All other sentences are irrelevant.

S27. Ans.(c)

Sol. The paragraph tells us about the position of India in Asia for innovation. Before gap, it tells that 70% of the patents are filed by MNCs. Therefore the answer must be sentence (c) which tells that remaining 30% of the patents are filed by Indian companies. Other sentences do not fit into the paragraph and hence are irrelevant. Hence sentence (c) is the right option.

S28. Ans.(d)

Sol. The paragraph is about personal views of the author about the freedom of expression and speech taking current atmosphere in the country as the point of discussion. Read the last few lines carefully, from there it can be inferred that only option (d) makes the most appropriate conclusion to the paragraph. Other options do not form the part of this paragraph.

S29. Ans.(c)

Sol. The paragraph here talks about the use of Kashmir issue for political or personal gain. If we read all the sentences, we find that sentence (c) fits to the paragraph as it talks about the growth and prosperity both in India and Pakistan. Others sentences are irrelevant as they do not go with the topic of the paragraph. Hence option (c) is more potent than others.

S30. Ans.(b)

Sol. The paragraph talks about the Bibek Debroy's suggestion to tax agricultural income and protests against it. If we see the options, we can conclude that sentence (b) connects with the paragraph as it tells about the reaction of Bibek Debroy's suggestion and its effect on farmers. Hence sentence (b) is the right option.

S31. Ans.(a)

Sol. D-A makes a combination and G should follow A. C-F makes another combination, giving a lovely message of "letting go". Hence the correct sequence to form a meaningful paragraph is EBDAGCF.

S32. Ans.(e)

Sol. B should follow E and C-A makes a combination. D must be the concluding sentence. Hence the correct sequence to form a meaningful paragraph is EBCAD.

S33. Ans.(c)

Sol. A must be the first sentence as it talks about the planned capital city of Andhra Pradesh i.e. Amravati. B-C makes a combination and E must be the concluding sentence as it ends with the most obvious question. Hence ABCDE is the correct sequence to form a coherent paragraph.

S34. Ans.(c)

Sol. The paragraph reveals the statistical figures of employment and unemployment in the country. A must follow E as it talks about the same period as mentioned in the sentence E. A-D makes a combination. Similarly C-B makes another combination as both the sentences can be connected with the two sectors i.e. public and private, they are talking about. Hence EADCB is the correct sequence to form a coherent paragraph.

S35. Ans.(a)

Sol. A should be the first sentence. C-E makes a combination. Hence ACEBD is the correct sequence to form a meaningful paragraph.

S36. Ans.(d)

Sol. Option (d) is the correct choice and is not a part of the coherent paragraph. The logical sequence of the coherent paragraph is ecba. Option (d) is not the part of the coherent paragraph as other options are focusing on the issue of sanctions against Iran and its implications on India. Option (d) on the other hand is talking about one particular aspect of the relationship.

S37. Ans.(c)

Sol. BAED forms a coherent paragraph. It is about gearing up for epidemic disease Chikungunya in India and preparations for its prevention. After reading all the sentences, we conclude that sentence (c) is not a part as it talks about some 'job' which does not link to other sentences. Hence sentence (c) is the right option.

S38. Ans.(a)

Sol. BECD forms a coherent paragraph while sentence (a) is not a part of the paragraph. The paragraph talks about the Modi and what differentiates him from others. We see that sentence (a) does not connect with the other sentences as it talks about opposition leaders' accusation regarding demonetization. Hence sentence (a) is the right choice.

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S39. Ans.(d)

Sol. Option (d) is not a part of coherent paragraph as other options are giving us an insight into the political scenario in Tamil Nadu while option (d) is giving more emphasis on the do's and don'ts for Sasikala which is quite abrupt.

S40. Ans.(d)

Sol. Option (d) is not a part of coherent paragraph. As other options tell us about the issuing of digital payment by RBI whereas option (d) is not in agreement or harmony with the theme of the passage.

S41. Ans.(b)

Sol. 'Similar' takes preposition 'in'. And alike is used as, 'We all are alike in one thing'. So, common is correct.

S42. Ans.(e)

Sol. Since 'behind' is there, unquestioningly 'leave' is the correct option.

S43. Ans.(d)

Sol. Option (a) is wrong since, no 's' or 'es' is suffixed to a verb when using with 'can'. Hence 'transform' is correct.

S44. Ans.(b)

Sol. 'Greater than' is used with numbers and 'larger than' is used with areas, etc. So, "name" is suitable.

S45. Ans.(c)

Sol. convince is in present tense so it is wrong. One may also get confused with option (b) but 'confident' goes well with the meaning of the passage.



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
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
