

RENOWNED VOCABULARY FOR ALL SSC EXAMS

1. STATUESQUE (ADJECTIVE): tall and dignified

Synonyms: beautiful, graceful

Antonyms: short, small

Example: He has a statuesque personality.

2. TRUCE (NOUN): peaceful solution

Synonyms: accord, agreement

Antonyms: continuation, war

Example: They always show truce to make their family happy.

3. REBUFF (NOUN): rejection

Synonyms: rebuke, reprimand

Antonyms: praise, compliment

Example: When my wife is angry with me, she will rebuff my attempts to get back in her favour.

4. COCKSURE (ADJECTIVE): arrogant

Synonyms: bumptious, obnoxious

Antonyms: humble, modest

Example: I don't know why but most of the times I find him the most cocksure fellow.

5. VITUPERATIVE (ADJECTIVE): abusive

Synonyms: defamatory, derisive

Antonyms: polite, respectful

Example: The critic's vituperative review was needlessly harsh.

6. HUBBUB (NOUN): a confusion of voices and other sounds

Synonyms: bedlam, clang

Antonyms: calm, peace

Example: The children filled the room with hubbub.

7. DEBILITY (NOUN): decrepitude

Synonyms: enervation, enfeeblement

Antonyms: soundness, healthiness

Example: Even though she beat cancer, she still dealt with debility from her battle.

8. FROLICSOME (ADJECTIVE): full of spirit

Synonyms: lively, romping

Antonyms: depressed, down

Example: Rahul is actually a frolicsome person.

9. LEAVEN (VERB): ferment

Synonyms: lighten, raise

Antonyms: darken, depress

Example: One should always try to leaven one's knowledge.

10. VAINGLORIOUS (ADJECTIVE): excessively proud of oneself

Synonyms: egotistical, haughty

Antonyms: timid, humble

Example: He was rather vainglorious about his own war record.

11. DEMURE (ADJECTIVE): reserved, affected

Synonyms: prim, reticent

Antonyms: bold, brave

Example: Despite her demure appearance, she is an accomplished mountain climber

12. INKLING (NOUN): idea

Synonyms: clue, hunch

Antonyms: knowledge, information

Example: The records give us an inkling of how people saw the world.

13. PORTENT (NOUN): omen

Synonyms: premonition, augury

Antonyms: doom, cataclysm

Example: She was not happy when the psychic told her the black cat represented a portent of bad luck.

14. VIE (VERB): compete

Synonyms: contend, strive

Antonyms: assist, support

Example: The competitive twins often vie for the attention of their parents.

15. VEHEMENCE (NOUN): intensity

Synonyms: fervor, frenzy

Antonyms: peace, peacefulness

Example: The vehemence of his temper was controlled by an affectionate disposition.
