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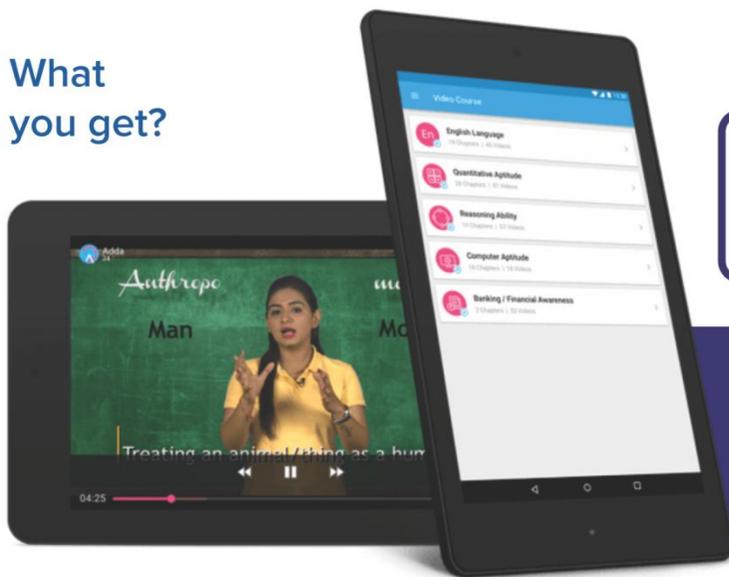
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

Direction (26-30): Study the following information carefully to answer the given questions.

A, B, C, D, E, F, G and H are seated in a straight line but not necessarily in the same order. Some of them are facing south while some are facing north.

Only two people sit right of H. Two people sit between H and C. A sits second to right of C. Two people sit between A and G. G does not sit adjacent to C. B sits third to right of F. F does not sit adjacent to C. Immediate neighbor of B faces opposite direction (Opposite direction means if one neighbor faces north direction then other faces south and vice-versa). The one who sits extreme end



of the line faces opposite direction (Opposite direction means if one neighbor faces north direction then other faces south and vice-versa). D does not sit adjacent to E. Immediate neighbor of D faces same direction (Same direction means if one neighbor faces north then other also faces north and vice-versa). B sits second to left of D and both face same direction. Immediate neighbor of H faces opposite direction (Opposite direction means if one neighbor faces north direction then other faces south and vice-versa). B faces towards north direction.

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




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
