S1. Ans.(b)

Sol. EVINCE: to display clearly and reveal the presence of a (quality or feeling). Hence Evince and Show are synonyms to each other.

S2. Ans.(d)

Sol. PERNICIOUS: means having a harmful effect, especially in a gradual or subtle way; Injurious. Hence Pernicious and Injurious are Synonyms to each other.

S3. Ans.(c)

Sol. EULOGY: a commendatory oration or writing especially in honor of one deceased. And Praise best expresses the meaning. Hence Eulogy and Praise are synonyms to each other.

S4. Ans.(d)

Sol. GARNISH: decorate or embellish (something, especially food). ADORN: make more beautiful or attractive. Hence both Garnish and Adorn are synonyms to each other.

S5. Ans. (b)

Sol. ABANDON: cease to support or look after (someone); desert. FORSAKE - abandon or leave. Hence both Abandon and Forsake are synonyms to each other.

S6. Ans. (a)

Sol. ODIOUS: extremely unpleasant; repulsive. Hence both Odious and Hateful are synonyms to each other.

S7. Ans. (c)

Sol. REPEAL: revoke or annul (a law or act of parliament). CANCELLATION- the action of cancelling something. Hence both Repeal and Cancellation are synonyms to each other.

S8. Ans. (c)

Sol. TENET: a principle or belief, especially one of the main principles of a religion or philosophy. BELIEF- an acceptance that something exists or is true, especially one without proof. Hence both Tenet and Belief are synonyms to each other.

S9. Ans. (a)

Sol. PECULIAR: different to what is normal or expected; strange. STRANGE- unusual or surprising; difficult to understand or explain. Hence both Peculiar and Strange are synonyms to each other.

S10. Ans. (c)

Sol. VIABLE: capable of working successfully; feasible. Hence both Viable and Workable are synonyms to each other.

S11. Ans. (d)

Sol. SINUOUS: having many curves and turns. SERPENTINE: move or lie in a winding path or line. Hence both Sinuous and Serpentine are synonyms to each other.

S12. Ans. (b)

Sol. ERRONEOUS: wrong; incorrect. INACCURATE not accurate. Hence both Erroneous and Inaccurate are synonyms to each other.

S13. Ans.(d)

Sol. ONSLAUGHT: a fierce or destructive attack. INVASION: an instance of invading a country or region with an armed force. Hence both Onslaught and Invasion are synonyms to each other.

S14. Ans.(b)

Sol. GROTESQUE: comically or repulsively ugly or distorted. BIZARRE: very strange or unusual. Hence both Grotesque and Bizarre are synonyms to each other.

S15. Ans.(c)

Sol. IGNOMINY: public shame or disgrace. Hence Ignominy and Disgrace are synonyms to each other.

S16. Ans.(b)

Sol. PROGNOSIS: forecast of the likely outcome of a situation. FORECAST: predict or estimate (a future event). Hence both Prognosis and Forecast are synonyms to each other.

S17. Ans.(b)

Sol. POACH: to trespass, especially on another's game preserve, in order to steal animals or to hunt. Hence both Poach and Hunt are synonyms to each other.

S18. Ans.(c)

Sol. REPARTEE: conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. RESPONSE: a reaction to something. Hence both Repartee and Response are synonyms to each other.

S19. Ans.(b)

Sol. EXHORT: strongly encourage or urge (someone) to do something. Hence both Exhort and Pressure are synonyms to each other.

S20. Ans.(d)

Sol. LURID: presented in vividly shocking or sensational terms. SHOCKING: causing a feeling of surprise and dismay.

S21. Ans.(b)

Sol. INDIGNANT: means feeling or showing anger or annoyance and EXASPERATE: has the meaning -infuriate or irritate intensely. Hence both Indignant and Exasperate are synonyms to each other.

S22. Ans.(a)

Sol. SUBTERFUGE: means to deceit used in order to achieve one's goal and STRATAGEM: means skill in devising plans or schemes or acuity used to outwit an opponent or to achieve an end. Being close in meaning both Subterfuge and Stratagem are synonyms to each other.

S23. Ans.(c)

Sol. TANTAMOUNT: means equivalent in seriousness to, virtually the same as. Hence both Tantamount and Equivalent are synonyms to each other.

S24. Ans.(d)

Sol. PILLAGE: means rob a (place) using violence and PLUNDER: means to steal goods from a (place or a person) typically using force. Hence Pillage and Plunder are synonyms to each other.

S25. Ans.(a)

Sol. EXCULPATE: means declare that someone is not guilty of wrongdoing and ABSOLVE: means to set (someone) free or declare free from guilt. Hence Exculpate and Absolve both are synonyms to each other.

S26. Ans.(b)

Sol. CHARLATAN: means a person falsely claiming to have a special knowledge or skill and QUACK: means a person who pretends professionally or publically to have qualifications he or she does not possess. Hence both Charlatan and Quack are synonyms to each other.

S27. Ans.(a)

Sol. AFFLICTION: means a cause of pain or harm and ORDEAL: means a very unpleasant and prolonged experience. Hence both Affliction and Ordeal are synonyms to each other.

S28. Ans.(b)

Sol. CONDONE: means to accept the behaviour that is considered morally wrong or offensive and PARDON: means an action of forgiving or being forgiven for an error or offence. Hence both Condone and Pardon are synonyms to each other.

S29. Ans.(a)

Sol. FECUND: means producing or highly fertile. Hence both Fecund and productive are synonyms to each other.

S30. Ans.(b)

Sol. FLAGRANT: means conspicuously offensive and NOTORIOUS: means infamous for some bad quality or deed. Hence being close in meaning both Flagrant and Notorious are synonyms to each other.
