1	You suddenly experience the ground shaking beneath your feet, causing nearby objects to tremble, signaling the occurrence of an earthquake, also known as a temblor. Earthquakes are the result of the Earth's outermost layer, its crust, undergoing movement. They occur frequently, but most go unnoticed because they are too small to be felt.	
2	Nevertheless, powerful earthquakes can have devastating consequences, such as landslides, tsunamis, flooding, and other hazardous events. Most of the damage and casualties occur in densely populated areas, where the shaking leads to broken windows, collapsing structures, fires, and other perils.  The process begins thousands of miles beneath the Earth's surface. To visualize it, think of the Earth as a hard-boiled egg, with the core as the yolk, the mantle as the egg white, and the outer crust as the eggshell. People inhabit the surface of the crust, while beneath it, within the crust, are massive puzzle-like pieces of rock known as tectonic plates. These plates encompass the Earth and are named after the regions they are situated under, including the African, Antarctic, Eurasian, Indo-Australian, North American, Pacific, and South American tectonic plates.	
3	The point directly above where an earthquake originates is termed the epicenter. Seismic waves, like ripples, propagate outward from the epicenter, generating vibrations that can be felt by people, often at considerable distances.  The distance at which people can perceive an earthquake's vibrations depends on its magnitude, which scientists gauge based on the intensity and duration of the seismic waves. The higher the magnitude, the more potent the earthquake, with a range from minor (magnitude 3 to 4.9) to moderate to strong (magnitude 5 to 6.9), major (magnitude 7 to 7.9), and extremely powerful (magnitude 8 or more).	

4	Earthquakes primarily occur along faults, where tectonic plates converge. Approximately 80 percent of earthquakes transpire along the perimeter of the Pacific Ocean, aptly known as the Ring of Fire due to the abundance of volcanoes in the region. This area is a nexus for various tectonic plates.	
5	Earthquakes can strike anytime and anywhere, even in regions far from fault lines. Therefore, it is wise to be prepared. Some measures to consider include discussing with your family the safest locations within your home during an earthquake, securing heavy objects that might fall or break, and ensuring you have an emergency kit containing first-aid supplies, a flashlight, a cell phone charger, and a battery-operated radio, along with an ample supply of food and water for at least 72 hours.	
6	During an earthquake, remember three key actions: drop, cover, and hold on. Drop to your hands and knees, crawl to a sheltered spot, and cover your head and neck under a sturdy table, desk, or bed. If no furniture is nearby, crouch down on your knees with your arms shielding your head and neck next to an interior wall (avoid doorways as they can collapse). If you're under a piece of furniture, hold on with one hand and move with it if it shifts. Stay in place until the shaking subsides


